TABLE, TABLECLOTH

We will assemble the Table to be placed in the middle of the room in the 【Eating Together】 scene. We will also make a Tablecloth using the Paper Pattern.



SALAD BOWLS

These are Salad Bowls to be placed on the Table. We will put the Salads in the Bowls.

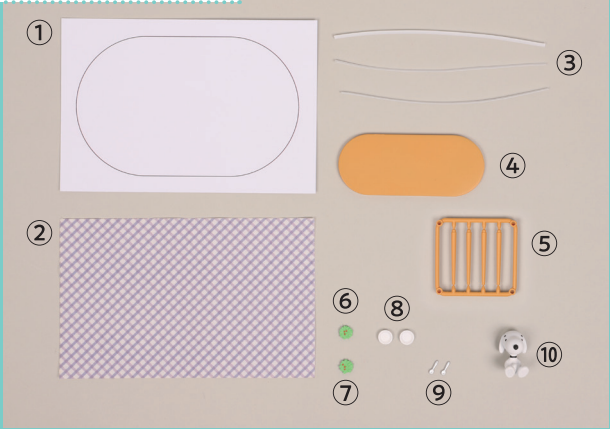

Making the Table,
Tablecloth & Salad Bowls

In this issue, we will assemble the Table for the 【Eating Together】 scene, and make a Tablecloth using the Paper Pattern and set it on the Table. We will make Salad Bowls as well.

- ① Paper Pattern ② Fabric ③ Wire×3 ④ Table Top ⑤ Table Leg×4
⑥ Salad A ⑦ Salad B ⑧ Bowl×2 ⑨ Spoon×2 【Figurine】 ⑩ Snoopy

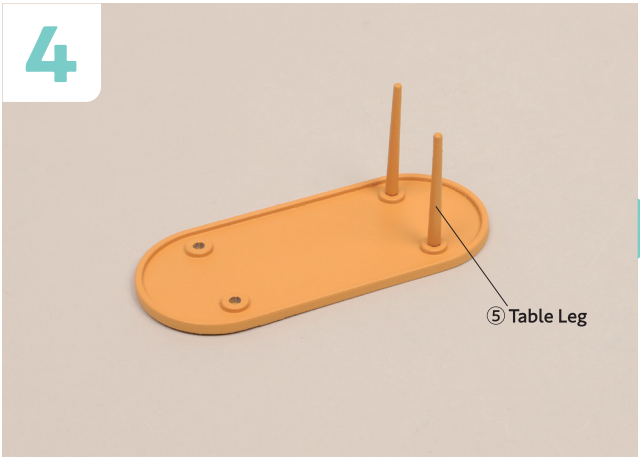

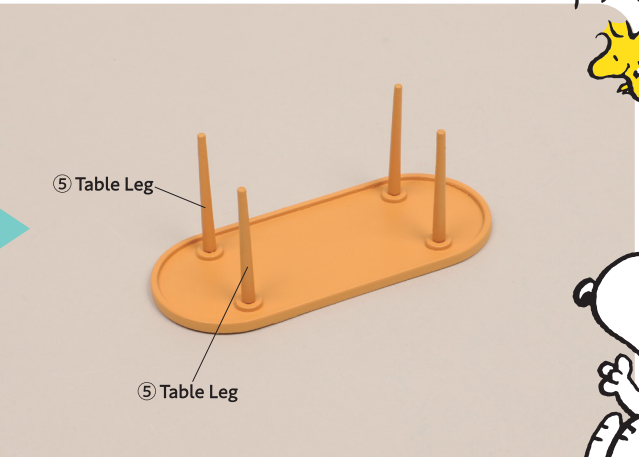

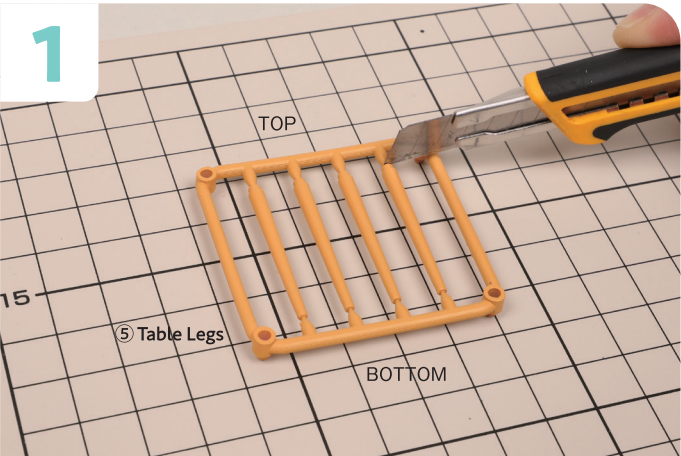
Making the Table



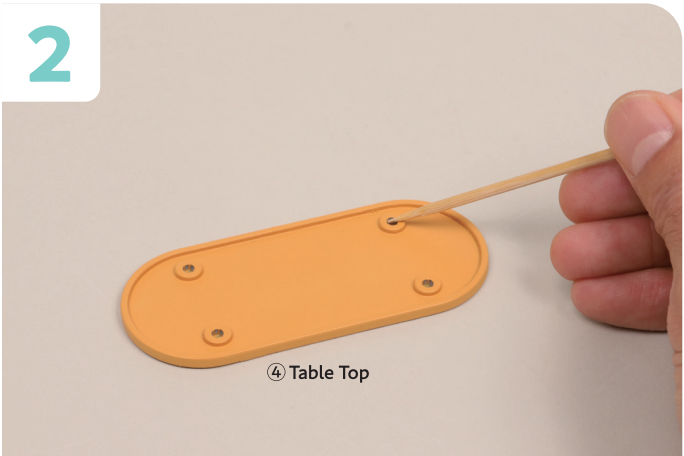
Assemble the other Table Legs one by one into the remaining holes in the Table Top in the same way.



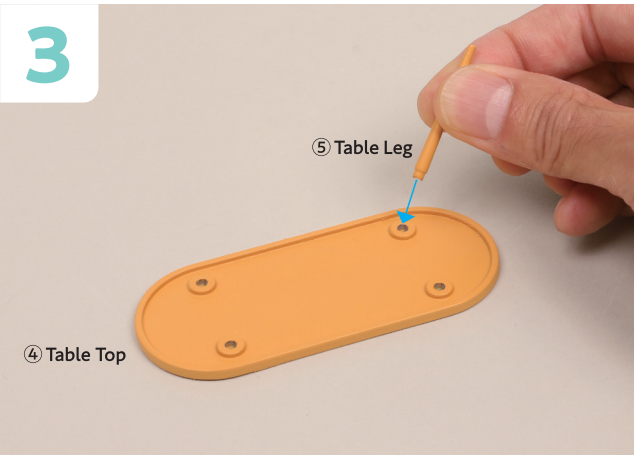
MAKING THE TABLE



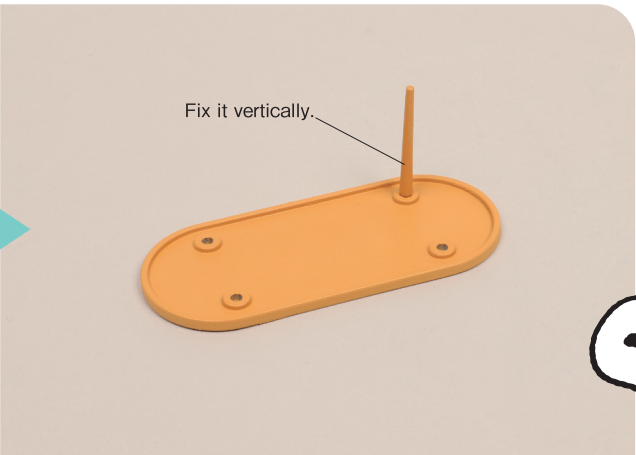
Use a cutter to cut and remove the ⑤ Table Legs from the joints.



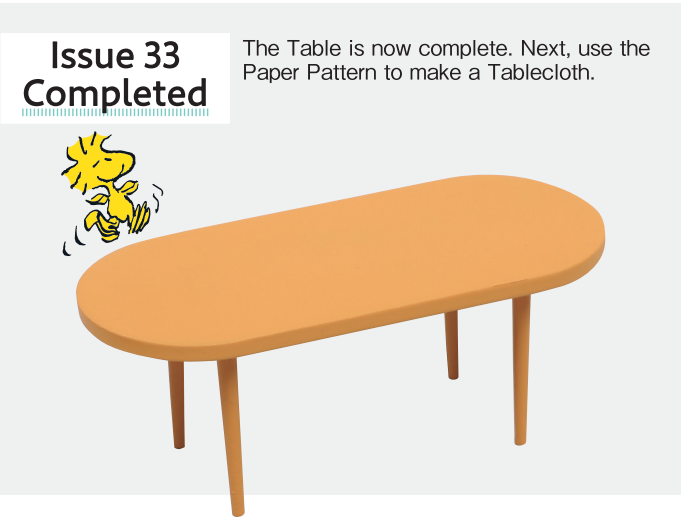
Now assemble the Table Legs to the bottom of the ④ Table Top. First, apply some quick-drying glue to the holes with the tip of a toothpick or the like.



Insert the thicker end of the ⑤ Table Leg into the hole in the ④ Table Top before the glue dries.



Check from directly above and from the side that the four Table Legs are not tipped or tilted.



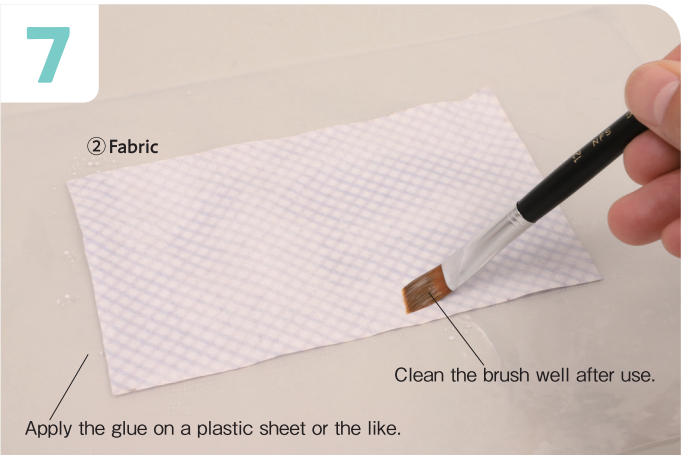

The Table is now complete. Next, use the Paper Pattern to make a Tablecloth.

MAKING A TABLECLOTH



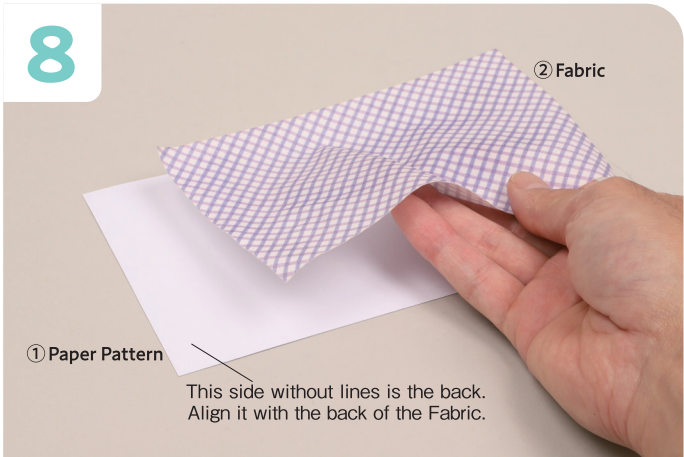
Coating the ② Fabric with water-dissolved wood glue can prevent it from fraying. First, dissolve the wood glue in twice as much water.



Apply the water-dissolved glue to the back of the ② Fabric with a brush.



Making a Tablecloth



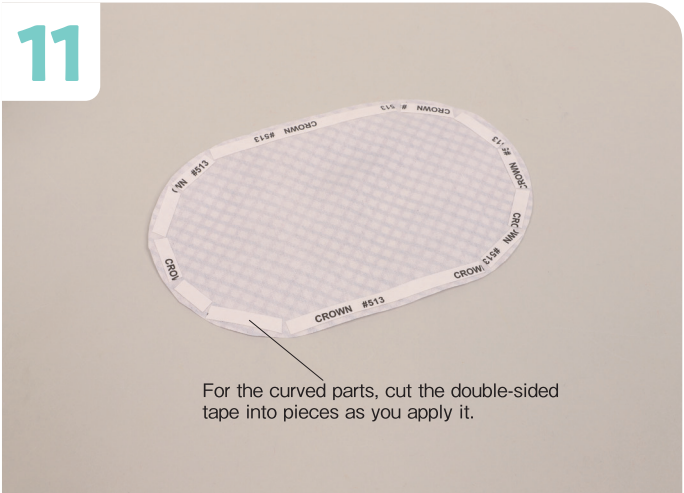
Wait until the glue is completely dry, then place the ② Fabric over the ① Paper Pattern with their backs aligned with each other.



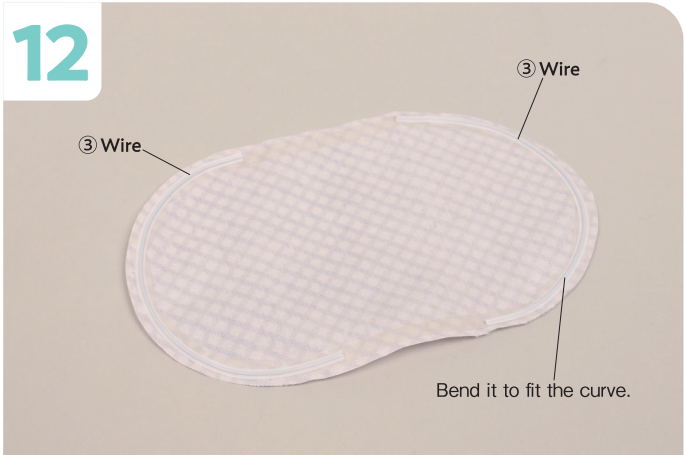
Apply cellophane tape or the like to the four corners to prevent them from shifting.



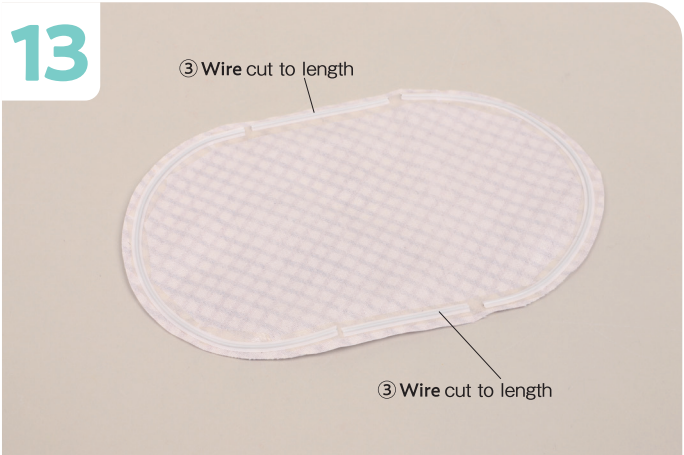
Press the Fabric firmly to prevent it from shifting, and cut it along the line of the Paper Pattern.



Apply double-sided tape along the perimeter of the back of the Fabric as shown.

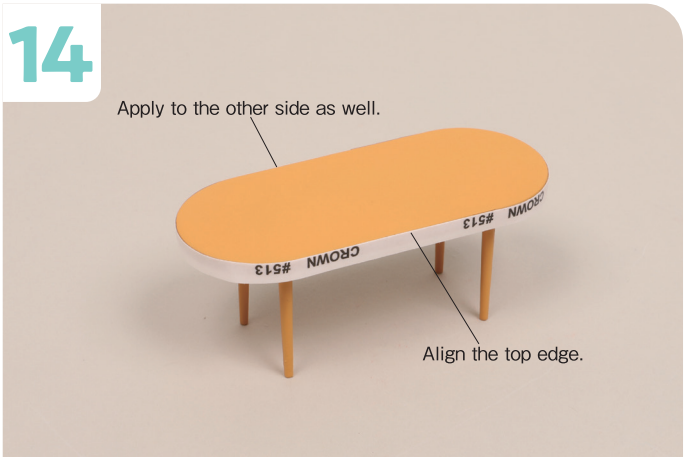


Peel off the double-sided tape backings and affix a ③ Wire to each curved part.

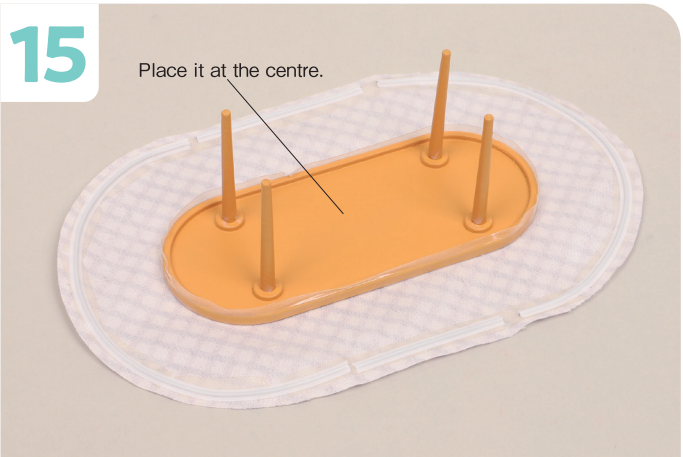


Cut and affix the excess ③ Wires to the straight parts. Cut them to length with scissors or nippers before affixing them.

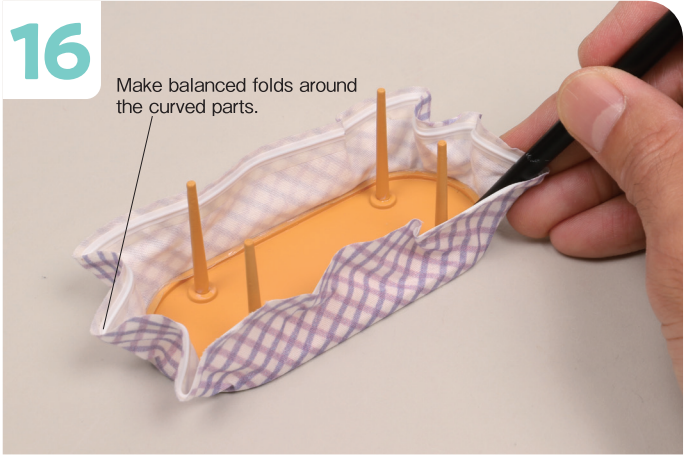
Making a Tablecloth



Apply double-sided tape around the rim of the Table Top.



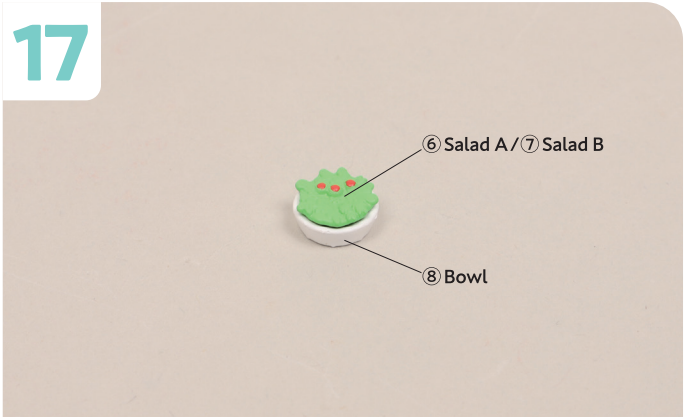
Peel off the double-sided tape backing and place the Table onto the centre of the back of the Fabric from step 13.



Now shape the Tablecloth. Make balanced folds on both sides for a natural look. It can be done with a brush handle or the like as shown.



MAKING SALAD BOWLS



Affix ⑥ Salad A and ⑦ Salad B to the ⑧ Bowls with double-sided tape or quick-drying glue.
